Dear Representative McGovern:

On behalf of the Society for Nutrition Education (SNE), thank you for introducing legislation to require the President to call a White House Conference on Food and Nutrition (H.R. 1869/H.R.2297). Earlier this year, SNE sent letters to members of Congress to request that they co-sponsor the measure and urged SNE members to directly contact their members of Congress to request that they do so.

As you know, the first such conference was held in 1969 and had a major impact on improving the effectiveness of federal programs in reducing food insecurity; improving nutrition, food safety and consumer protection; providing nutrition education in schools, kindergarten through grade twelve; and expanding educational and job opportunities. Given persistent problems associated with nutrition and food related issues, including incidence of diet-related diseases, escalation of childhood and adult obesity, all too-frequent breakdowns in our food safety system, and failure of most Americans to eat in accordance with the dietary guidelines, there is an urgent need for re-evaluation of federal programs designed to improve the nutritional health of Americans.

Many policies and programs are being implemented nationwide at local, state, and federal levels. Bringing together the key government agencies as well as leaders working on issues of hunger, food insecurity, nutrition education, and nutrition science will focus attention on actions to improve successful collaborative programs, address continuing needs, and maximize emerging opportunities.
